Course Title: Disasters in Film and Media

Course Credits: 3 credit hours
Prerequisites: None

Course Description:

Examines how contemporary culture perpetuates myths of natural and technological disasters. Students deconstruct and analyze reality from the myths in various types of media.

Program Outcomes:

Students will gain a better understanding of:

- the scientific process of various hazards in various media
- identifying widely believed disaster myths

- observing various forms of disaster culture
- contrasting roles of individuals and stereotypes in films
- how disaster myths impact emergency management decisions

Assessment:

Knowledge of scientific processes of various hazards will be demonstrated through assignments.

Emergency Management fundamentals (response, preparedness, recovery, and mitigation) will be demonstrated through assignments.

Professionalism in Emergency Management will be demonstrated through an oral presentation in the final project.
